## **DIOCESAN NEWS**

Bishop Michael Jarrell announced on Wednesday, June 2, 2010 that he has appointed Father Curtis Mallet, JCL, to serve as Vicar General of the Diocese of Lafayette. In addition to this appointment, Father Mallet remains Pastor of St. Genevieve Parish in Lafayette. The primary role of a Vicar General is to assist the bishop and share administrative authority in the overall governing of the diocese. Bishop Jarrell's decision to appoint Father Mallet stems from the recent health issues concerning the current Vicar General, Msgr. H. Alexandre Larroque, JCD, VG. While Father Mallet does not replace Msgr. Larroque in this capacity, his appointment does help to ensure that the duties of the Vicar General continue to be fulfilled as Msgr. Larroque recuperates from his illness.

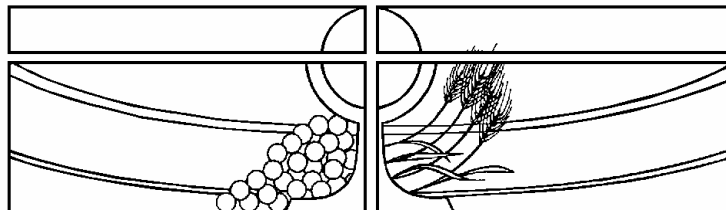

### IMPORTANT CCD INFORMATION

#### Attendance Policy:

For the St. Mary Magdalen Summer 2010 CCD program there will be no make-up opportunities. Diocesan policy requires a child miss no more than 2 days of CCD. Days missed (no more than 2) must be documented with a valid medical excuse.

If you know a child will not fulfill the attendance requirements of St. Mary Magdalen's CCD Program, one of two other CCD programs must be attended in it's entirety to avoid repeat of that grade level. This option will require, at time of enrollment, a letter of permission from the Pastor of your church parish.

St. Theresa CCD- June 7-18  
Holy Rosary CCD- June 14-25  
SMM CCD- July 12-23

#### 1st and 10th Grade CCD:

These grades are very important in laying the foundation for the Sacramental year that follows. Therefore, attendance and passing grade of 1st and 10th grade CCD is a mandatory requirement before moving into the St. Mary Magdalen First Communion and Confirmation Programs. Failure to attend, any absences without a valid medical excuse, and/or missing more than 2 days will result in delay of the Sacrament and repeat of 1st or 10th grade CCD.

### EPISCOPAL LINEAGE/APOSTOLIC SUCCESSION OF THE BISHOPS WHO ORDAINED FR. BLANDA

Listed below are the direct lines of Apostolic Succession of the ordaining bishops of our parish priests. Each bishop received his Episcopal ordination from the hands of another bishop. Each apostle was ordained a bishop by Jesus on Holy Thursday evening during the celebration of the Last Supper. Each apostle likewise ordained men priests and bishops. This passing on of the sacrament of Holy Orders from Jesus to our present day is called Apostolic Succession.

Please note that the date listed next to the name of the bishops signifies the date that he was ordained a bishop by the bishop listed below him. Unfortunately, church records cannot find the name of the bishop who ordained Cardinal Rebiba. Fr. Blanda and Fr. Theriot are very proud to be able to trace their lineage all the way back to the 16th century.

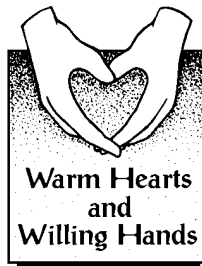

### Stewardship Thought

June 6, 2010

Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

*"...He said the blessing over them (the fishes and the loaves), broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd"* Luke 9: 11b-17

None of the Gospels tell the exact details of how four or five thousand men, plus women and children, are fed with a few loaves and two fish. The Church teaches us that the miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fishes was a prefiguration of the Body and Blood of Jesus. But let us consider another miracle, just as great. Jesus knew the Semitic ethic that required people to share with others. He knew people carried food and wine under their garments, but refrained from taking it out for fear others had not brought their own. Note that Jesus blessed the loaves and fish and gave them away. He did not keep any for himself. Did people see *his generous act and decide to share what they had with one another?* In the context of God's gift to us of *reason and free will*-the ability to choose to be generous or not to be generous, what is the greater miracle: multiplication of loaves and fish, or *multiplication of generous hearts?* Which makes us a greater witness to the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist?

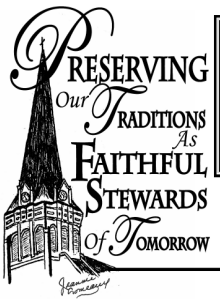
